Assistant or Associate Dean of Hospital Operations College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences Texas A&M University

The College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences (CVM) (<http://vetmed.tamu.edu/>) at Texas A&M University invites applications/nominations for the position of Assistant/Associate Dean of Hospital Operations and Chief Medical Officer of the Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital (VMTH). We seek an individual with strong leadership skills who is forward thinking, team-oriented, and understands the intersection of our teaching, research, and patient care missions. Candidates hired at the Assistant Dean rank may be staff, clinical track, or tenure track faculty. The successful candidate applying for Assistant Dean must have a DVM degree or a professional or academic degree in a relevant field. Candidates hired at the Associate Dean rank must be able to receive tenure on arrival. For Associate Dean the successful candidate must have a Ph.D. or DVM degree or equivalent terminal degree in a relevant field. Candidates must possess outstanding communication and interpersonal skills. A tenure-track or non-tenure track appointment is possible, and will depend on qualifications.

The VMTH is a world-class animal healthcare facility that sees over 18,000 small animals and 9,000 large animals per year. An additional 30,000 to 40,000 state-owned animals are treated annually through external CVM and VMTH programs. The hospital has continued to expand its operations by actively investing in cutting edge medical equipment, collaborating closely with referring veterinarians and clients, and building relationships with supporting departments. As such, the VMTH Chief Medical Officer will work closely with members of the Departments of Large Animal Clinical Sciences, Small Animal Clinical Sciences, and Veterinary Pathobiology to deliver state-of-the-art healthcare to our veterinary patients; support our growing clinical trials and one health emphasis; and foster an environment that values teaching. The VMTH Chief Medical Officer also serves on the Executive Committee of the CVM and chairs the Hospital Board of the VMTH. Application review will begin with first consideration given to applications received by August 31, 2015, however, the search will continue until the position is filled. **All interested individuals are encouraged to apply.
