The selected individual will participate in clinical teaching and service within the Food Animal Section, didactic lectures in the professional curriculum, and graduate and resident training. A tenure track position would also have expectations of independent and/or collaborative research.

Qualifications: A DVM or equivalent degree is required. Diplomate status or board eligibility in an appropriate specialty college (American College of Theriogenologists, American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine – Large Animal, American Board of Veterinary Practitioners) is preferred. We seek candidates with an advanced degree and research experience and/or candidates with appropriate practice experience with an emphasis on production medicine and/or theriogenology. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time the appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment. Excellent communication skills are required. Eligibility for faculty veterinary licensure in the State of Alabama is also required.

Responsibilities: The duties of this position will be divided between clinical responsibilities, didactic lectures and graduate and resident training. Teaching activities will be conducted principally in a clinical setting. Clinical responsibilities will include independent, primary case care within the Food Animal Section. The food animal caseload is predominately beef and dairy cattle, but small ruminants, camelids, and swine are also seen. The successful candidate will advance the ambulatory and production medicine caseload of food and fiber animals. The effort allocation toward clinical responsibilities and research will be established to meet the incumbent's qualifications and interests and the service's needs.
