CLINICAL LECTURER IN EQUINE EMERGENCY MEDICINE AND SURGERY

The Department of Clinical Sciences, College of Veterinary Medicine, Auburn University invites applications for two full-time non-tenure track Clinical Lecturer positions in Equine Emergency Medicine and Surgery. These positions offer a unique opportunity for veterinarians who have completed residency training (ACVS, ACVIM, or ACVECC), especially those completing equine surgery residency programs to improve their clinical skills and sit for the certifying examinations. Each position will provide an opportunity for an additional post-graduate training program with enrollment in the graduate school toward an MS or PhD degree or a fellowship program for ACVECC certification, depending on the candidate's interest. The individuals selected will participate in clinical teaching and service within the Equine Section. Each position is renewable annually for up to five years, contingent upon satisfactory progress. A DVM or equivalent degree is required. We seek candidates who have successfully completed an equine surgical residency. For individuals seeking post graduate research training, the incumbent must be accepted into the Auburn University Graduate School.

Responsibilities: The duties of these positions will be divided between emergency clinical responsibilities and research or fellowship training leading to an advanced degree and/or credentials. Teaching responsibilities include the clinical and didactic instructional activities of professional students in veterinary medicine and postgraduate training programs related to equine emergency and critical care. Clinical responsibilities will include independent, emergency primary care within the equine section of the J.T. Vaughan Large Animal Teaching Hospital. Appropriate time off clinical and emergency duty will be allotted to those individuals studying for certifying exams. The equine caseload is predominately pleasure and sport horses.

Requirements/ Qualifications: Qualified applicants must hold a DVM or equivalent degree. We seek candidates that are ACVS board-certified or qualified to sit for the certifying ACVS examination at the time of interview, but ACVIM or ACVECC candidates/diplomates are also encouraged to apply. The per annum salary is \$52,500. The candidate selected for these positions must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time the appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment. Excellent communication skills are required. Eligibility for faculty veterinary licensure by examination in the State of Alabama is also required.

Review of applications will commence on **June 24, 2016** and will continue until a qualified applicant is recommended for appointment.
